### PARTICULARS

- 1. Pursuant to DepEd Memorandum No. 223, s. 2016 on Strengthening the Implementation of the Gulayan sa Paaralan Program in Public Elementary and Secondary Schools Nationwide, this Office reiterates its adherence to the said policy.
